

**The Miami University chapter of Phi Delta Theta fraternity** has been found responsible for violating the Code of Student Conduct, Section 109 (Hazing).

In September, the Office of Ethics & Student Conflict Resolution received a complaint regarding an alleged hazing incident that took place in January 2011.

On October 24, 2011 during a hearing in the Office of Ethics & Student Conflict Resolution, representatives of Phi Delta Theta acknowledged the hazing incident and indicated a variety of internal actions taken by the organization as a result of the incident

The following sanctions have been imposed upon on the fraternity by the University in conjunction with actions taken by the organization:

- Phi Delta Theta will be placed on disciplinary probation effective October 24, 2011 to December 20, 2012.
- In accordance with actions already taken by Phi Delta Theta, the organization will provide the Office of Ethics and Conflict Resolution with a copy of the current new member education manual as well as the revisions for the upcoming 2012 new member education program.
- Phi Delta Theta must host a comprehensive hazing education program. There must be 100% attendance of the new member classes of 2011 and 2012 and 80% of active members must attend.
- Upon completion of an alumni advisory board development plan that is currently being revised by national headquarters, a copy of the plan must be submitted to the Office of Ethics and Conflict Resolution.
